Shifting from volunteer to team member, at Lanark County Community Justice, supporting youth and families through a Restorative Justice process, Elle developed, implemented and delivered evidence based best practice trainings and workshops across the County to community members, addressing restorative and trauma informed practices. Elle continues as a volunteer facilitator with Lanark County Community Justice, facilitating restorative forums, addressing the harm caused between accused, victim and community members.

Elle has worked with Cornerstone Landing Youth Services since early 2019, as a Housing Case Manager, supporting and advocating for youth experiencing or at risk of experiencing homelessness. Through an evidence-based housing first approach, Elle supports youth to access safe, affordable housing, through securing financial assistance, navigating support services, registering and continuing education and employment. Elle also volunteers at the Smiths Falls District Youth Center, promoting communication and physical activity. Creating conversations and safe spaces around healthy relationships, conflict resolution and community issues.
